OUR LADY AND ADVENT

Following Bishop Swarbrick's Pastoral Letter last week and in light of the Marian Solemnity and memorial this week we continue to consider how our Mother the Church, proposes Mary to us as Christmas draws ever nearer. She teaches us how to live Advent. Mary is, in some sense, Advent personified. God the Father had prepared her from the first moment of her life to be a worthy mother of his Son. Like a faithful daughter of Israel, she had prayed throughout her youth for the coming of the Messiah. When she was a young girl, she discovered that she was part of God's answer to that prayer, but in a way that would far have exceeded any Hebrew maiden's prayers: not only would the Messiah be her son, but her son would also be God. Her "yes!" to the Archangel Gabriel launched the proximate preparation for the birth of Jesus the Messiah.

Advent could be considered an entering into Mary's response of faith, following and encountering that response serves as a guide for us along our own pilgrimage of faith. As it were, we are taken into the embrace of Mary in Advent, climbing into Mary's womb to listen to the beat of her contemplative heart and to be lost in wonder at the treasure that is waiting there. Within Mary is the greatest of all mysteries, the fruit of that womb is our Christmas joy.

The Church wants us to be bearers of Christ to others, following in the steps of Mary, who first bore Christ to the world, the first missionary of the Good News, when she hastened to greet her cousin Elizabeth.
