### ST BLAISE

One of the yearly customs we keep as Catholics is the blessing of throats for St Blaise's memorial, 3<sup>rd</sup> February. From an early age we may be able to recall this tradition, perhaps taking it for granted this was just what we do without much reflection. Perhaps you are not accustomed with this, some traditions have lay hidden in recent decades. We know the great number of saints canonized are beyond counting, yet few have a tradition so widespread, but how good and powerful it is to receive regular blessings and particular blessings to protect and guard us in our Christian combat.

We know little now about St Blaise himself. The main facts we can say with confidence, he was raised in a wealthy Catholic family and became Bishop of Sebastea (Armenia) at a young age, and he was martyred in 316. St Blaise's days as bishop would have coincided with the *Edict of Toleration* [311], granting freedom to practise the Christian Religion in the Roman Empire. A freedom that put a spotlight on Bishops to show a lead in a new way for Christians to live and be more accepted. Yet, he was a bishop confronted with persecution still taking place towards his local church, as the *Edict* took some decades to be accepted universally in Armenia.

The blessing of throats comes from a story of St Blaise healing a woman's son from choking on a fishbone. The use of candles in the blessing recalls a story in which a woman sent St Blaise candles while he was in prison so that he might be able to read Scripture. This act of gratitude was prompted by St Blaise commanding a wolf to return to the woman her pig, which the wolf had stolen. In addition to healing throats, St Blaise was known for healing animals and being able to command them. St Blaise, *pray for us*.
