!! HABEMUS PAPAM !!

We have a Pope! I am sure that you have all been glued to the unique unfolding drama of our Catholic religion in Rome this week. How wonderful it has been to see our western secular society so intrigued with our religion at this time. Watching as you did, you prayed for the Holy Spirit to be powerfully at work in the Conclave and among the Sacred College of Cardinals as they prayed for Peter to appear from among their number. Indeed, Peter did appear and is among us to witness to the world to the Resurrection and to strengthen us, his brothers and sisters in the saving faith of Jesus Christ.

Pope Leo XIV, who in this world was Robert Francis Prevost OSA, has been chosen as the 267th successor of St Peter. It is a truly enormous responsibility for the Pope to teach, govern, and sanctify the whole Church, to call all people into relationship with Jesus Christ and to maintain the unity of faith in spite of ourselves and the malicious prowling of the devil in this world to wound us, do us harm, and to lead us away from the light of the gospel. Perhaps, our last Leo, Leo XIII offers us a prayer with which to accompany our new Pope, a powerful prayer to accompany each of us, the Prayer to St Michael the Archangel [which we recite after weekday Masses in our parish].

For us in the Diocese of Lancaster, one connection that we can claim, and which ties us to the new Holy Father is his being an Augustinian, the same religious order as our emeritus Bishop Michael Campbell. In fact, he was General of the Order when Bishop Campbell was consecrated in 2008 and so was indeed present in Lancaster Cathedral for the episcopal consecration. Therefore, our new Pope has been with us in Lancaster!
