ST CUTHBERT - SECOND PATRON OF THE DIOCESE OF LANCASTER

When entering our Parish Church of St Joseph our attention is immediately grabbed by the towering figures of eight saints on the East wall behind the High Altar. A prominent reminder of the saints in heaven, their abiding closeness to us and their joining us at the Altar, joining us in worshipping God in the banquet of the Lamb. One of those statues is the figure of St Cuthbert, whose influence as a patron stretches across Northern England. According to tradition, Cuthbert was a shepherd boy who became a monk, and later prior at Melrose Abbey. After the Synod of Whitby in 664, he became prior of Lindisfarne and gently winning over his community to more a fullsome love and practice of their life in common with the customs established in the Roman church. He was zealous in preaching the Gospel, which he was called upon to do so across the north of England, though he solely wished to live the life of a hermit. In 676 he left the monastery and lived in solitude on the nearby island of Inner Farne. For the last two years of his life he served as bishop of Lindisfarne, but returned to his island to die, on 20th March 687. His remains were later removed from Lindisfarne to escape Viking raiders and enshrined in Durham Cathedral.

St Bede sums up St Cuthbert's character: 'like a good teacher he taught others to do only what he first practised himself. Above all else he was afire with heavenly love, unassumingly patient, devoted to unceasing prayer, and kindly to all who came to him for comfort.... His self-discipline and fasting were exceptional, and through the grace of contrition he was always intent on the things of heaven.' He also tells us that 'Cuthbert was so skilful a speaker, and had such a light in his angelic face, and such a love for proclaiming his message... that all confessed their sins to him... they laid open to him the common troubles of humanity ... in the hope of gaining comfort... No one left unconsoled." May we go to St Cuthbert with our troubles and temptations and receive the protection and consolation of the saints, our wonderful brothers and sisters in Christ!

Our Lady of Fernyhalgh, Preston [PR2 5RR]

The annual pilgrimage from the Church to Ladyewell shrine will take place on Saturday 20th September. Mass in the Church will be at 11.00am, followed by Procession of the Blessed Sacrament down to the shrine. This shrine is so close and so we should do our best to attend. *Both Shrine sites are designated shrines for the Holy Year in the Diocese of Lancaster. At these churches/churches you can obtain the Jubilee Indulgence which the Holy Father has granted for the year. To receive the Indulgence, first go to Confession, receive Holy Communion and Prayer for the Holy Father. Then at the Shrine, pray the Our Father, profess our faith [Apostles' Creed or Nicene Creed], and pray to the Blessed Virgin Mary.
